CHEMISTRY FOR YOU AND YOUR KIDS

How To Give Pepper Some PEP!

You will need

Safety glasses 8-oz cup or small bowl black pepper baby powder liquid dish detergent

Safe Science Tip:

Both baby powder and pepper can irritate eyes, nose, and throat. Shake both the pepper and the baby powder away from your face.

- Fill the cup with water and cover the surface of the water with a thin layer of pepper.
- Place a drop of detergent in the middle of the pepper. Describe what happens. Does any pepper sink or does it just move?

What do you think is making the pepper move? Put a second drop of detergent in the water. Does the pepper do the same thing again? Why or why not?

Wash out the cup very well, but this time put baby powder on the water instead of pepper. Add a drop of detergent as in step 2. What happens this time? Is it different from the pepper? Why do you think it acts this way?
