ABOUT THE SPEAKER: Mary Virginia Orna is Professor of Chemistry at The College of New Rochelle. She is an ACS Fellow (2010) and a 1984 recipient of the Chemical Manufacturing Association's Catalyst Award for excellence in college chemistry teaching, the 1989 CASE (Council for the Advancement and Support of Education) New York State Professor of the Year and National Gold Medalist Award, a recipient of the 1989 Merck Innovation Award, the 1996 Western Connecticut ACS Section's Visiting Scientist Award and the 1996 recipient of the James Flack Norris Award for Outstanding Achievement in the Teaching of Chemistry. She received the American Chemical Society's 1999 George C. Pimentel Award in Chemical Education, the 2008 Henry Hill Award, and the 2009 ACS Award for Volunteer Service. She has presented over a dozen plenary lectures and named lectureships. She was a Fulbright Fellow in Israel (1994-95) where she lectured at The Hebrew University. Professor Orna was a major contributor to the ACS symposium series on The Posthumous Nobel Prize in Chemistry, Volume 2, Ladies in Waiting for the Nobel Prize (2018).

ABOUT THE PRESENTATION: This talk will highlight the extraordinary contributions that women chemists have made to our health and well-being through such inventions as chemotherapeutic agents, Kevlar, Scotchgard, Permanent Press fabrics, and easy self-diagnosis for diabetes. All of these women have been inducted into the National Inventors' Hall of Fame, an institution that celebrates the creative and entrepreneurial spirit of great inventors by showcasing exhibits and presentations that allow the public to experience the excitement of discovery, creativity and imagination.

ABOUT THE PRESENTATION: Chemical detective work in the form of modern chemical methods can be used to examine both ancient and medieval artifacts. Professor Orna will discuss the ways these probes are used in: clarifying the techniques used in making these objects, determining their content, and dating their origins. The variety of methods used in the examination of such materials as ancient textiles, pigments in medieval manuscripts, medieval stained glass, Middle Eastern obsidian and pottery, and 20th century art forgeries will be discussed. Although those methods give great insight into the objects in question, there are limits to such technology; the limitations of those techniques will be presented.

SUMMARY OF THE SAN DIEGO SECTION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES January 10, 2019

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> –Last year: \$550 deficit; projected budget income was \$92K, actually received \$89K; Charitable Trust issues resolved

<u>Proposed 2019 Budget</u> – Councilor travel for the year projected to be less than usual since the Fall Meeting will be in San Diego; sponsorships have been consistently ~\$21K for past several years, Justification for Proposed Budget: no event organizers have proposed decreasing allocations for any activities; ChemExpo underspent allocation last year so keeping that the same, Distinguished Scientist; Earth Day, 50-60 Luncheon, Holiday / Year-End Wrap-Up kept consistent, Mad Science allocation was previously approved by ExComm, MedChem requested slight increase; Project SEED allocation remains the same; website maintenance increased to \$2K reflecting vote of ExComm.

Action: Increase projected income to \$25K and add dividends to incomes and present adjusted budget via e-mail


