

Drug-Target Engagement in Live Cells

Lyn Jones, Ph.D. Jnana Therapeutics (VP, Chemical Biology), Boston, MA Wednesday, May 31, 2017

Continuing this year's theme, *Chemistry Everywhere!*, the San Diego Local Section of the ACS hosted **Dr. Lyn Jones** as seminar speaker for its May monthly meeting. **Dr. Jones** delivered an outstanding lecture on the use of chemical probes, as well as new chemical and biophysical techniques, to study drug-target engagement in live cells. Target identification and validation are critically important in the overall process of bringing a novel therapeutic drug to the market. A caveat inherent in many chemical biological approaches is a lyse-then-label workflow. For many reasons, it is more meaningful and representative to label-then-lyse, because the behavior of a cell lysate is much different from intact cells. Therefore, a need exists for cell-permeable chemical probes that can engage a given target in intact cells and can tag the protein(s) of interest for downstream identification and quantification. This approach can be regarded as clinical or in-cell chemoproteomics. From the chemist's perspective, this area is ripe for innovation, as each situation requires thoughtful attention to tuning chemical reactivity for practical use in the study of processes in live cells. For example, the recent emergence of sulfonyl fluorides and fluorosulfates has enabled a variety of elegant studies of drug-target engagement, many of which were highlighted by **Dr. Jones** during his fascinating lecture, enjoyed by over 90 people in Keck Amphitheatre at TSRI.
