SCIENCE BEYOND THE BENCH: A CAREER IN SCIENCE WRITING

A SEMINAR BY JYLLIAN KEMSLEY

On February 21, 2018, the Local Section of the ACS in collaboration with the UCSD Society for Women in Graduate Studies (SWIGS) was excited to present a seminar by **Dr. Jyllian Kemsley** entitled "Science Beyond the Bench: A Career in Science Writing". **Dr. Kemsley** is an Executive Editor for Chemical & Engineering News (C&EN), an ACS publication geared towards a chemistry audience with which many of our readers should be familiar. Her talk focused on her path from research scientist to science writer and how others could do the same.

Dr. Kemsley's seminar traced her career from past to present. She completed her undergraduate degree at Amherst College with the initial intent of becoming a lawyer. Instead, she found herself lured by the world of chemistry, leading her to earn a BA in Chemistry. She then worked at Merck for two years as an analytical chemist before starting graduate school at Stanford University. Her doctoral work sought to characterize the active sites of biomolecules that use iron. As she approached the end of her program, she felt uncertain about her future in both academia and industry. This brought her circuitously to science writing. Because she had always been a strong writer, she was accepted to the University of California, Santa Cruz Science Writing Program. This "journalism bootcamp" gave her the skills she needed to start in her career as science writer.

Dr. Kemsley's seminar delved into the process of creating a mainstream publication like C&EN. She walked the audience through the pipeline of story development from the "pitch" to final print formatting. Furthermore, she discussed the differences between being a science reporter and her newly promoted role as Executive Editor. With her overview of science writing as a career and how aspiring writers can pursue a similar track, she was adamant that the path to becoming a science writer is not linear. "You can't just check the boxes", as is common for academic tracks. Instead, she advises those interested in science writing to just start writing—write a blog, write for your institution, write on Twitter. Her seminar culminated in a number of questions from engaged audience members about everything from coverage of their own science by the media to how they themselves could seek out alternative careers. Overall, the seminar was well attended and well received.

2018 U.S. NATIONAL CHEMISTRY OLYMPIAD (USNCO)

We need volunteers for the exam on **Saturday, March 10, 2018** from **9 am to 11 am** or **Sunday, March 11, 2018** from **9 am** to 11 am at the University of San Diego in **The Shiley Center for Science and Technology – Rooms 129, 130 and 133**. The exam lasts approximately 2 hours.

**Note: Any student may take this preliminary screening exam but students must be citizens or permanent residents (green card holders) to be invited back to take the U.S. National Exam.

Please come 30-45 minutes early to help set-up and register/check the names of the students.

Registration information: Please check the students' names in the registration form and have them double check the information listed (especially the email addresses). If their names are not registered, please have them fill out the form. We can only accommodate another 10-15 unregistered students.

Exams will be conducted for 2 hours. Extra time is not allowed. Proctors are not allowed to answer any questions related to the exam questions.

We provide the following: ACS exam, Scantron paper, scratch paper. All of these should be collected after the exam.

Only non-programmable calculators are to be used on the national exam and on the ACS Local Section exam, if used. The use of a programmable calculator, cell phone, or any other device that can access the Internet or make copies or photographs during the exam is grounds for disqualification.

We provide student certificates at the end of the test.

Feel free to bring things to do, read or work on during the 2-hour proctoring period.

CHEMISTRY FOR YOU AND YOUR KIDS

Putting Your Two Cents In

How many pennies can you put in a cup filled with water before it overflows? Let's have a contest!

You will need

Eye protection, 8-oz plastic cub • pencil and paper for recording • 200 pennies • paper towels

- 1. There are two jobs in this game. One player carefully puts the pennies in the cup one by one. The other player keeps count on a piece of paper of how many pennies go into the cup before the water overflows.
- 2. Put a triple layer of paper towels on your work surface. Fill a cup all the way to the top with water. Place the cup on the work surface between you and your adult partner.
- 3. Predict how many pennies can be put in the cup before it overflows. Record your prediction and your adult partner's prediction on your paper.

Start placing pennies in the cup. Make sure you count them correctly so that you can tell whose prediction is closest. What's keeping the water from overflowing? How many pennies went into the cup before the water overflowed?

Now try a new game!

- 1. Fill the cup with water again
- 2. Take turns with your adult partner putting pennies in the cup.
- 3. Whoever puts the penny in that makes the water overflow is the loser.
