# AACC-ACS Joint Meeting Studying the Effects of Marijuana Use

### Thomas Marcotte, Professor In Residence, University of California, San Diego

Dr. Marcotte is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry and Center Manager of both the HIV Neurobehavioral Research Center and Center for Medicinal Cannabis Research. He recently served as the Director of Mental Health for the UCSD Owen HIV Clinic, which serves 3,000 HIV patients, and as a Co-Director of CHARTER, a national multi-site study of the CNS impact of treatments for HIV. Dr. Marcotte received his B.A. from UCSD, M.A. from the University of Connecticut, Ph.D. in clinical psychology from CSPP-Los Angeles, and completed postdoctoral training in neuropsychology at UCSD.



Dr. Marcotte will provide an update on recent findings regarding what is known about the relationship between automobile crashes and cannabis use in states that have legalized recreational use. He will also review challenges in determining cannabis related impairments in the field. Lastly, he will discuss the air

Lastly, he will discuss the aims and methods being undertaken in a recently funded project examining the effects of acute cannabis use on driving performance, as well as its effects on current, and potentially new, field assessments.

**Dr. Philip Sobolesky** is a Clinical Chemistry Fellow in the Pathology Department at the UC San Diego School of Medicine in the laboratory of Dr. Robert Fitzgerald. Dr. Sobolesky conducted postdoctoral studies and earned his Ph.D. in Biological and Biomedical Sciences at the Medical University of South Carolina.

Dr. Sobolesky will detail the development of a mass spectrometry assay to detect marijuana usage in breath, blood and oral fluid by LC-MS/MS. He will review the method development and discuss significant findings of the project.



**Joe Macchi** is a corporate attorney at Duane Morris LLP, and represents emerging growth clients in a variety of industries including biotechnology, bioprocessing, and diagnostics. Mr. Macchi earned his J.D. from the University of San Diego School of Law and his B.S. in Business from the University of Southern California.

Mr. Macchi will discuss recent California laws relating to cannabis sale and distribution.



**Ryan Smith** is a patent attorney at Duane Morris LLP and represents clients in the biotechnology, pharmaceutical, and diagnostic industries. Dr. Smith earned his J.D. at the University of San Diego School of Law and his Ph.D. in Chemistry from the University of California at Berkeley. Dr. Smith is also the Chemistry and Law Chair of the San Diego Section of the American Chemical Society. Dr. Smith will be the moderator of this event.

## Modeling Human Biology, Drug Response, and Progressive Liver Disease Using 3D Bioprinted Human Liver Tissue

Dr. Dwayne E. Carter Organovo Holdings Inc., San Diego August 16, 2017

On Wednesday, August 16th, we had the pleasure of hosting **Dr. Dwayne Carter** of Organovo at The Scripps Research Institute. Organovo is a biotech company located in San Diego and their focus is on building living human tissue that functions like native tissue. **Dr. Carter** shared with us the exciting research being done in the field of bioprinted liver tissue and drug development.

The focus of his talk centered on his research in nonalcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) including comparisons between in vitro bioprinted tissue and patient tissue, testing of drugs, and evaluating biomarkers in their 3D-printed liver tissues. In addition, he presented preliminary data demonstrating the key features of NASH (nonalcoholic steatohepatitis) such as steatosis, fibrosis and inflammation via nutrient overload followed by inflammatory stimulation using prototypical inducers.

The audience was captivated by the information shared and asked many questions both during and after the presentation. The work being done at Organovo shows great promise in bringing drugs to the clinic better results in drug translation than current animal models can provide.



#### CHEMISTRY FOR YOU AND YOUR KIDS

### FLAVORINGS: Let your taste buds blossom (part 1)

One group of food additives we can't leave out in the flavorings *group*. Flavorings that most people like to taste are the sweeteners. People who prepare food need to know just how sweet certain sweeteners are. Unlike most scientific testing, food scientist can test a sweetener's sweetness by tasting it. Try the following activity and see how sweet it is!

#### You will need

Safety glasses - Sugar - Brown sugar - Honey - Fructose (in grocery near artificial sweeteners) - Measuring spoons - Water - Masking tape - Ink pen - 4 plastic or paper cups - cottons swabs

- 1. Mix 1 tablespoon of sugar in 1/4 cup of warm water until all the sugar dissolves. This is your standard for sweetness. Your job is to find out if brown sugar, honey, or fructose are less sweet, just as sweet, or sweeter than sugar.
- 2. With your masking tape and pen, label 4 cups "sugar," "brown sugar," "honey," and "fructose."
- 3. Add 1/4 cup of warm water to each cup and then add 1 tablespoon of brown sugar, honey, and fructose to its labeled cup. Stir each solution with a separate spoon until it is dissolved.
- 4. Take a little sip of water to clear your mouth for your first taste test. Dip one end of a clean cotton swab into your standard sugar solution and touch the swab to your tongue.
- 5. Throw the swab away. Think about how sweet the sugar tasted. Take another sip of water. Dip another swab into the brown sugar solution and touch the tip to your tongue. Does the brown sugar taste sweeter, less sweet, or just as sweet as the sugar standard? Write down what you think. Have your adult partner take the same test.
- 6. Take another sip of water and taste your standard again. Take another sip of water and taste your honey solution. Record how its sweetness compares to sugar. Does your adult partner agree? Try this taste test with your last sweetener to see which of your sweeteners is the sweetest of them all!

### **ABCChem - Plenary Speakers Announced!**


