

San Diego Section, American Chemical Society Executive Committee - Zoom Meeting Feb. 2, 2022, 6:30 p.m.

<u>Attendees:</u> Sean Anderson, Hui Cai, Surya De, Juan Gonzalez-Gonzalez (Chair), Desiree Grubisha (Treasurer), Carolina Ibarra, Julann Miller, Ken Poggenburg, Jim Shih, Ryan Smith, Bill Tolley (Secretary), Christina Vialva, David Wallace

ExComm Minutes for January (BT / JGG) - Approved

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> (**DG**) – Money from IPG money was identified as part of another payment from National ACS; income: interest at SDCCU; expenditures: \$30 for seminar, storage locker, travel reimbursement for Juan to attend Leadership Institute

<u>IPG Event</u> (JGG) – "Cooking with Chemistry", over 100 registered at this point, first 30 registrants will receive a cooking kit with ingredients for the demonstration; ingredients list is available on Eventbrite, the only semi-difficult item to obtain is a candy thermometer

<u>Leadership Institute</u> (JGG) – Juan presented review of glassblowing event at the Leadership Institute, seminar used IPG funds; due to Juan's presentation, many from the institute registered for the upcoming SDACS cooking seminar; Juan met Judy Giordan, Angela Wilson (Juan is hoping to use her connections to induce someone to seek the position of chair for next year)

<u>Upcoming Event - Super STEM Sat.</u> (JGG for JT) – Mar. 11 at CSUSM, looking for volunteers (ACS not a presenter but is working to get volunteers)

STEM Expo (JGG) – Petco Park, because of Super STEM, it seems best that we not dilute our efforts, format for the Petco event has changed since the last time we participated

<u>Law Seminar (JGG)</u> – March or April, Don Lewis as the presenter discussing patenting of CLICK chemistry (Nobel Prize level work); needing a venue, possibly Sanford or Lilly auditorium





Greater San Diego Science & Engineering Fair (JS) – Wed. 3/15, we have not responded regarding our intent to participate; an in-person event but may allow for virtual judging, which allows early judging but doesn't facilitate discussions with the presenters; we need 6-10 judges to be effective, anticipate ~25 projects to assess in ~90 minutes, (one previous presenter filed a patent based on the project results); time required for in-person judging 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.;

<u>Picnic</u> (JS) – Picnic in the past was held in June after school year has ended; a proposal is to hold the picnic in Fall when students are in town; thus, it becomes an opportunity for university students to mix with professionals in the Section; considering Sept. 23

Chem Olympiad (JGG) - Mar. 18 virtual event, needing proctors, 2-3 hours
