

About the Speaker

Connie M. Weaver, Ph.D.

Dr. Weaver is a Distinguished Research Professor in Exercise and Nutritional Sciences at San Diego State University, San Diego, CA and Distinguished Professor Emerita of Foods and Nutrition at Purdue University, Indiana where she taught food chemistry and nutrition courses and was department head for 25 years. Dr. Weaver is an elected member of The National Academy of Medine and a fellow of the American Society for Nutrition, the Institute of Food Technologists, the American Heart Association, and the American Society of Bone and Mineral Research. She is a member of the Science Advisory Boards of FDA, the California Prune Board, California Walnut Board, and Arkansas Children's Nutrition Center. Dr. Weaver is past president of American Society for Nutrition.
