CHAIR NOTES

CHAIR NOTES

Among the many influential Black women chemists, several names stand out for their groundbreaking work and enduring legacy, such as:

Dr. Marie Maynard Daly, the first African American woman to receive a Ph.D. in chemistry in the United States, whose research on the effects of cholesterol paved the way for advancements in cardiovascular health.

Dr. Alice Ball, whose most notable achievement was the development of the "Ball Method," a revolutionary treatment for leprosy that was not accredited to her name until many years after her unfortunate, early passing.

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, a distinguished cancer researcher and cell biologist, who made significant contributions to our understanding of the mechanisms underlying tumor growth and metastasis. Her groundbreaking research has had a profound impact on the development of cancer treatments and therapies.

As we celebrate the achievements of these remarkable women and countless others, let us also reaffirm our commitment to fostering an inclusive and equitable scientific community. Together, let us continue to champion diversity, equity, and inclusion in science, ensuring that the next generation of scientists is as diverse and vibrant as the world we seek to understand.





Meeting convened: 6:30 pm

Secretary Appointment:

Harshada Sapre, member of the UCSD student affiliates chapter, was a candidate for the Secretary position of the local SD ACS Chapter.

Motion: To appointment Harshada Sapre secretary of the SD ACS chapter —- Approved

Modifying Bylaws to Change Quorum:

- Randall Smith, past chair, invited to join the meeting to vote.
- Quorum was met via the following:
 - Under the second sentence of Section 2 of Bylaw X in our existing bylaws, the elected Chair (Christina) appointed Past SDACS Chair Randy Smith to be an ad hoc committee chair (the "Past Chair Committee").
 - BYLAW X (Committees and Their Duties)
 Section 1. There shall be a Nominating Committee as provided for elsewhere in the bylaws.
 - Section 2. The standing committees of the Section shall be determined by the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee may add or delete standing committees to meet the need of the Section. Other ad hoc committees may be appointed from time to time by the Chair.
 - By Bylaw V, Section 3, the "Executive Committee" includes "chairs of the standing committees."
 - BYLAW V (Organization)
 - Section 1. The officers of the Section shall be: Chair, Chair-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Chair and Chair-Elect shall be MEMBERS of the SOCIETY and the Section. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be members of the Society and the Section the offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by one person.
 - Section 2. The Section shall have Councilors and Alternate Councilors as authorized by the SOCIETY.





Section 3. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Section officers, Councilors and Alternate Councilors, the Immediate Past Chair, Members-at-Large, and **chairs of the standing committees.**

Yearly outreach event hosted at CSUSM. Requesting a 1 year sponsorship from SD ACS of \$5000 for Super STEM Saturday on March 9 2024. Expected 12,000 attendees. In accordance with SD ACS mission statement of promoting chemical literacy to the general public. Money allocated from outreach funds.

Motion: To allocate \$5000 from outreach funds to assist in sponsoring Super STEM Saturday —- **Approved**





<u>Treasurer's Report and 2024 Budget Proposal (DG):</u>

Budget Proposal:

Revenues:

- Line 3: Funds for DEI grant deposited on January 5th in the amount of \$1800
- Line 3a: Counselor Travel \$24000. \$2000 per counselor per meeting will be sent to each section as the proposed way to reimburse council travel. 6 counselors each for 2 meetings has a proposed amount of \$24000.

Expenses

- Line 21: Distinguished Scientists Awards Banquet: \$5000
- Line 30a: Food \$10000. \$2000 added since last year.. Estimating \$2000 per event at 5 events per year.
- Line 30c: Venue/Eventbrite Fee (=12 x \$10 fee) \$120
- Line 31: Picnic \$4000. \$1000 added since last year. Picnic proposed to be in September.
- Line 43: Counselor Travel \$26,300

Rest of the line's items are consistent with last year's budget.

Proposed change for Line 26: Holiday party

- allocate \$1000 additional funds to line 26 for a total of \$4000 in the proposed budget. Treasurer's Report:
- Line 67a and 99b: removed from the budget as they were grants and funds were used.
- Account summary is current. Total financial assets: \$587,280.51 as of February 2024.

Motion: Approve 2024 budget with discussed changes —- Approved

<u>Updating Local Section Chair Information on ACS.org (CV and JG):</u>

Local section information is out of date on the community connections website where the annual report is submitted. Juan Gonzalez has reached out to ACS and sent an updated roster accurately reflecting officer information. Governance of local sections on ACS website is up to date on chair and counselor information, however, needs to update lack of chair elect. Links to sites where information is not accurate should be collected and can be sent to national ACS for updating by David Wallace.

<u>January Seminar Review (CV):</u>

Peak attendance of 47 people was half of the expected attendance according to Eventbrite (96 sign ups). Recording of the seminar will be sent out as requested by attendees who were unable to attend at the time of the event. Speaker confirmed that they were okay with being recorded. Recording will be edited before being sent out due to disruptive behavior





from few attendees.

Suggestions for future seminars include starting the event at 6:30-7pm instead of 6pm. Few attendees had issues with accessing zoom link due to lack of an eventbrite account.

Greater San Diego and Science Engineering Fair (Jim):

Emails sent out to judges who previously attended the event by Jim. Proposing call of judges sent out through email for additional judges. Currently have 3-4 confirmed judges, ideally need 10-12 or 8 minimum.

Website does not actively reflect events of the month, needs to be updated and can help with letting the community know about the event details. Will be communicated to Rick to make necessary changes.

Walk-In Agenda Item: ACS Spring Conference (DG):

Counselors need to be contacted to confirm their attendance at the conference, if not, an alternate counselor must attend. Secretary needs to generate a yellow ticket for alternate counselors if any are attending. Other counselors will be contacted by Christina to confirm attendance.
