The Science of Microplastics: Impacts on Health and Ecosystems



Dr. Scott Coffin Pharmacokinetics Research Scientist

About the Speaker:

Dr. Scott Coffin has a PhD in environmental toxicology and serves as a Pharmacokinetics Research Scientist at the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment in the California Environmental Protection Agency. Since 2014, Dr. Coffin has led research projects to characterize hazards and risks of microplastics and their associated contaminants, and currently serves as subject matter expert on the topic for the California EPA.

About the Talk:

Concerns over microplastic pollution led California to pass laws in 2018 to monitor and manage its impact on drinking water and coastal ecosystems. These laws require the State Water Resources Control Board, the Office of Environmental Health and Hazard Assessment, and the Ocean Protection Council to develop methods to analyze and monitor microplastics, assess risks to humans and aquatic life, and recommend strategies to reduce contamination. Through widespread collaboration, our working groups validated methods to analyze microplastics in drinking water as small as 20 microns – which will be used to monitor California's drinking water supplies soon. We also convened an expert workshop to assess the impact on humans and aquatic ecosystems, finding limited evidence that microplastics may cause adverse reproductive effects and oxidative stress in mammals, and derived thresholds to assess ecological impairment. This talk covers the state's ongoing research and actions on the topic.
