Brief biography: I have been an ACS member since 1990, and have been active in the section in 2007-10, having served as Member-at-large during that period. In addition, I served as section chair in 2008-9, and led the section to be awarded "Best Large Section" by the National ACS in 2008 for our program. I am an organic chemist by training, having received a BA in chemistry from Franklin and Marshall college in 1990 (one of the few ACS-recognized BA chemistry programs) and my PhD in organic chemistry from the University of Colorado in 1994. I then held an NIH postdoctoral position at Pennsylvania State University in 1994-6. After my postdoc appointment, I was hired into the pharmaceutical and drug discovery industry with a job at NexStar Pharmaceuticals in 1996. Since then, I have specialized in drug discovery and combinatorial chemistry, oligonucleotide therapeutics, outsourcing and contract research, and oligonucleotide diagnostics. I have spent time in the industry in Colorado, Arizona, West Bengal in India, and San Francisco. I moved to San Diego in 2006, where I have spent time working for Discovery Partners, a contract research drug discovery firm, Illumina, a genomic and genetic instrumentation company, and finally at Hologic, developing new oligonucleotides for use in PCR diagnostics that are utilized to improve women's health outcomes.

I hope that I can become more active once again in the San Diego ACS section in ways that will allow me to contribute to the promotion and advancement of chemists and chemistry in the local area.


Celebrating a Local Superstar: Congratulations to Dr. Joseph Wang's 2024 ACS Award in Analytical Chemistry!

Joseph Wang Ph.D UCSD

Joseph Wang is a Distinguished Professor of Chemical and Nano Engineering, a SAIC Endowed Professor and the Director of the Center of Wearable Sensors at University of California San Diego (UCSD), USA. Over the past 2 decades, Professor Wang has made pioneering contributions to the fields of analytical chemistry, including biosensors for health, environmental and defense applications, and of wearable sensors for non-invasive biomarker monitoring. Wang is a member of the US National Academy of Inventors and a fellow of the RSC, ECS and AIMBE. He has authored over 1250 research papers, 12 books, and 60 patents. He has been a has been a Thomson Reuters Highly Cited Researcher since 2015, published over 1300 papers that received 170,000 citations (H Index 209). Wang holds Honorary Professor from 8 different universities. Wang is the recipient of 3 National American Chemical Society Awards for Analytical Chemistry (2024), for Electrochemistry (2006) and Chemical Instrumentation (1999). He also received the Ralph Adams Pittcon Award in Bioanalytical Chemistry, the 2022 Talanta Medal, the 2021 IUPAC Analytical Chemistry Medal, and the 2021 IEEE Sensor Achievement Award and the 1994 Heyrovsky Medal of Czech Republic.
























































