Reporting to the Head Scientist, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA), is offering a two-year research fellowship position in the Conservation Research laboratory (Projected End Date 8/31/2027, At-Will employment applies). The successful candidate will provide key scientific skills and expertise as part of the 'Carbon Reduction for Art in Transit (CRAIT)' project, funded by IMLS. This project research and test alternative and more sustainable packaging materials for art shipping with the goal to replace (where possible) the use of non-recyclable, non-environmentally friendly materials and reduce the carbon footprints of art crates.

CRAIT is an expansion of a previous pilot program, conducted at LACMA, where several crates were tested using different packing systems. The crates were tested with different shock and vibration parameters to evaluate the mitigation of the materials used and carbon footprints was also calculated.

This research fellowship opportunity provides a unique chance to work in a highly collaborative role with a wide reach across the organization, touching on program areas as well as research and collection care. The fellow will have the opportunity to work closely with LACMA's team and the partners in the CRAIT project to contribute to a groundbreaking project that is addressing pressing challenges in the cultural heritage field.

Responsibilities

Research of art crates, packaging system, experimental design.

Assist the CRAIT core team.

Use advanced statistical methods to analyze data and present research findings through technical reports.

Present research findings at professional conferences and contribute to peer-reviewed journals.

Organize and manage sample preparation, data, reports, and literature review tasks according to priority.

Develop strong communication and collaboration skills to work independently and as part of a team.

Encouraged and supported to attend specialized training courses and participate in professional meetings and workshops for professional development.

Recap: IPG event: Chemistry of Art Conservation (CV/JG)

Event had a high retention of participants based on sign-ups (28 out of 30 attended). Participants seemed to really enjoy the event. Received a lot of feedback from the event, including strong interest in having it again next year. It was suggested that the event be submitted for the ChemLuminary award due to the unique ideas, the strong execution and applicability of the theme.



Recap: ACS Annual Picnic (CV)

80 total sign-ups. Peak attendance was 45-50 people. Low submissions for dessert competition this year. The music, location and food received positive feedback. Participation/attendance from undergraduate and graduate students need to be encouraged. Consider scaling down the venue to a smaller picnic area for future years.

Upcoming Event Status Report: Queer in STEM: A Historical Quandary (CV)

Event is taking place on October 10th at Home Lab UCSD. Event is being funded through the DEI grant. UCSD office of innovation and commercialization is a sponsor for this event, providing \$500 of support. Low on registrations currently. CV has reached out to local community centers, as well as other connections to promote this event. Can create a raffle for swag bags to encourage attendance.

Upcoming Event: Distinguished Scientist Award Dinner (JS, JT)

20 participants for the event so far. Butcher shop requires an initial breakdown of headcount for meals one week before. Colored tickets will be given out to participants based on the type of meal they requested. Event will be advertised to chemistry departments at schools to encourage more attendees.


