Dear ACS San Diego Members,

As we enter the heart of summer, July offers us not only sunshine and warmth but also a chance to reflect on some pivotal moments in the history of chemistry. On July 3, 1826, French chemist Antoine-Jérôme Balard announced the discovery of bromine, element 35, to the Académie des Sciences in Paris—marking a significant addition to the halogen family. Additionally, on July 27, 1921, Sir Frederick Banting and Dr. Charles Best successfully isolated insulin at the University of Toronto—an achievement that revolutionized the treatment of diabetes and has saved countless lives.

Speaking of medicinal chemistry, we were also pleased to welcome back Dr. Nicholas Meanwell, who generously returned to give his lecture on the development of temsavir, following technical difficulties during his original presentation. His talk detailed the discovery of this powerful HIV-1 entry inhibitor, which emerged from a phenotypic screen and was optimized into the approved drug fostemsavir (marketed as Rukobia). Dr. Meanwell walked us through the structure–activity relationships, pharmacokinetic challenges, and clinical journey of this groundbreaking therapy. We are extremely grateful for his time and willingness to share such a rich and inspiring story in modern drug discovery.

Changes/Approval of May Minutes

Motion #1: Approve May 2025 Minutes — M/S/P Approved with 1 abstention

Treasurer Report

Treasurer Desiree Grubisha was unable to attend this evening, but reported that two sponsorships came in for the MedChem Symposium. No other transactions beyond regular monthly expenses.

Recap Meetings

Dr. Matthew Kromer gave a virtual talk on May 27, 2025 on Wildfire Chemistry and its effects soil and air and the relevance to firefighters and to society. With the notice coming a bit late as we set up what was happening for May, we were happy to have 22 in attendance out of the 36 who registered.

Future Meetings

Dr. Nicholas Meanwell will be doing a reboot of his talk on Inhibitors of HIV-1 Attachement on June 19, 2025 at 6pm. The previous session was unfortunately cut short due to technical difficulties, but Dr. Meanwell has graciously agreed to return.

July will be the MedChem Symposium and possibly the 5-year Luncheon, so we will look for an August speaker.

WD-40 can do virtual anytime, but in-person would be best in October or March when more chemists are on the west coast. They invented WD-40 here and still have a small presence of chemists, but the actual R&D is in New Jersey now. They still do a lot of chemical problem-solving in San Diego, but it is not as interesting. We want R&D Chemists for their stories and what's coming in their field. In Person with samples would draw more outside interest. Ask for March in person or August virtual or in October if the Distinguished Scientist/Awards Banquet is moved.

Blue Nalu - September Discussing with their PR folks to try to get a protein chemist.

Jiyue is working on a possible August event as well.
